It has been a whirlwind of activity, and Contigo and I have learned so much from the instruction!

Equally enriching with the instruction and progress in our training, is realizing the generosity, fellowship and kindness of my friends and family. These people in my life listen to my melt-downs (I do have them, just ask my husband), help me any time and any day of the week (more on that in the next paragraph), and share in my passion for dressage over thoughtful conversations, laughter and great food (you all know who you are!).

### Playing and paying it forward

At some point, I need to share with members all that my husband and kids do to support me, because they are MY team. But I need to close now with a special acknowledgement of my good friend and farrier, Jim Laufenberg. Jim learned his trade working on the track in Illinois. He picked up shoeing right after he completed his tour of duty from the Navy. He married his high school sweetheart, Priscilla, and they built a life here in Madison soon after. Jim built a successful farrier business while Priscilla worked as a nurse. He showed Quarter horses and was a serious driving competitor for many years. He is one of those wise horsemen that has seen and done so much,

and has so much to teach us.

Jim has been my farrier since about 2003. I met him before we built our Hidden Pond Farm. When my farrier at the time decided to leave the business to do security work, I gave Jim a call. I remember his response, "I would be honored."

We've been through some stuff together since then. He turned 70, for one. I turned 40. He did all the work on Coby as he went through rehab after the trailer accident. Once, when Coby lost a shoe away from home, I let another farrier reset him. That farrier took off Coby's size 3 shoes and cut his foot down to fit size 1. He came home very lame and was on stall rest for months. When Jim saw the work, he took my face in both of his hands with tears in his eyes and said, "Pam, don't you EVER let this happen to another horse of yours again. Never again!"

Jim really cares about horses. Well into his seventh decade on this earth, Jim still regularly helps his neighbors, is trustworthy and loyal to his customers, and remains a good citizen to the industry. His particular interest is helping horses with good shoeing that other farriers have given up on.

But that's not all. He came to Caryn Vesperman's to lend his forge to the branding. On a Friday morning of a lesson with Janet

Foy, he came to my house within 30 minutes of my call (at 6:45 a.m.) to put a shoe back on Contigo. And, he still trims my young horses, who are not always polite like Jim is.

I am beyond grateful to have Jim as my farrier and my friend. So members, if this story makes you think of someone in your life, take a moment and let them know how much you appreciate them. Jim would be glad to know that his story of kindness and generosity has been paid forward to someone else! And if Jim is YOUR farrier...give him a hug.

Between training her horses, teaching dressage lessons, judging on the Welsh circuit, and teaching a drill team, Joann manages to keep each day of her horsey life interesting.

"When I was little, I was the typical horse crazy kid," Joann said. "I would go to the adult section of the library to read all the horse books."

She even recalled a time when she was sent to the principal's office for drawing horses in class.

"I was lucky enough to have tolerant parents and a good 4-H leader," Joann said. Her leader consistently lined up horses for the kids to ride so they could learn on a variety of horses.

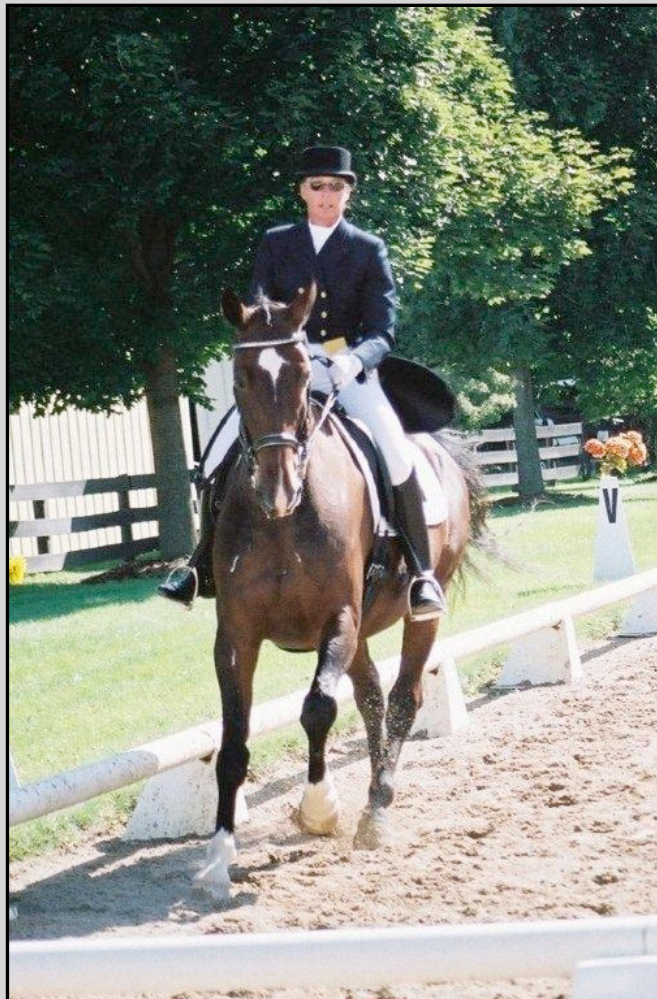
Joann spent her younger teenage years showing on the 4-H circuit, taking lunge lessons with a dressage instructor, and riding the trails of the Kettle Moraine. She also took a boatload of jumping lessons, showed jumpers, and tried to ride as many different horses as possible.

After Joann graduated high school, she went to UW-Waukesha and UW-Madison to take some classes, but eventually decided to attend the Meredith Manor School of Horsemanship in West Virginia. She also met the love of her life and husband, Greg, while she was there.

"He was very supportive while I was starting my professional riding career," Joann said.

After she returned from West Virginia, Joann immersed herself

in training horses. She spent the 1980s training Welsh hunter ponies, dressage horses and show hunters, but by the 90s, more dressage shows were popping up in the area, so her clientele turned purely dressage.

"I had been using dressage to improve my hunters, and decided I wanted to use dressage just to improve my dressage," she said.

And, she had always been more interested in this discipline: "It was more intricate and challenging... Plus, I was tired of falling on my head." So Joann focused her talents on dressage, training with Lois Heyerdahl, Hubert Rohrer and Janet Foy.

Joann's real superstar was Kosmic. She bought him as an unbroke two-year-old and did all of his training up through the Grand Prix level, earning her USDF Gold medal and Gold Freestyle Bar. Many of Joann's students have also earned USDF Silver and Bronze Medals.

Joann said there are so many misconceptions about dressage. It's not just about fancy moves. She feels sometimes people forget about the basic training behind this art. She said accuracy is so important and also stresses riding forward into a steady contact.

"If the ride is accurate, you know your horse is on the aids," she said.

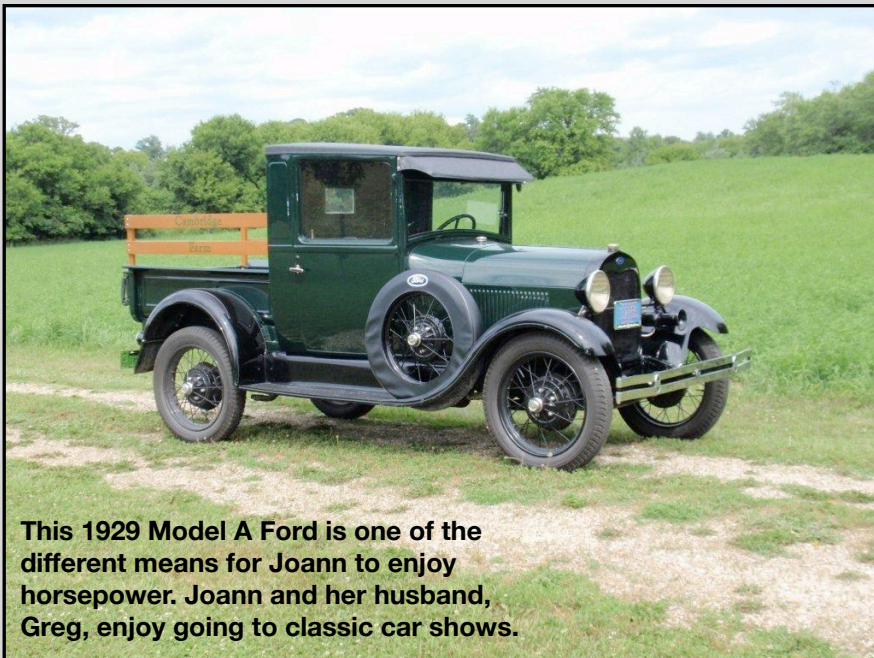
Joann travels around to different barns and horse shows, teaching

and helping her students to remember these fundamentals of dressage.

"She's very apt at reading someone's potential and pushing them to that potential," said Lisa Caine, one of Joann's students. "She has great instincts, and I feel she can get me showing at Grand Prix level."

Joann is also heavily involved with the Welsh breed. She judges on the Welsh circuit, breeds Welsh ponies, including her USDF All-Breed Champion, CF Ladysmith, and is currently training one of her Welsh ponies, Gallod Fantastic, in dressage, where he is earning points in the 70th percentile.

### Most memorable experience with a horse or at a horse competition?

Years ago, I was at a show competing on my mare, Wynter. She has a tendency to be a bit wily in the ring and is very clever. Just when I feel I have things figured out with her, she seems to come up with something new for me to learn to navigate through. The learning experiences she has given me have been monumental and seemingly never ending. I realize now the gift she has given me by being who she is.

Anyway, at this particular show, we were eliminated on two separate occasions on account of disobedience and/or exiting the ring before the end of the test. Not one of our shining moments.

Needless to say, I was frustrated and disappointed, as I am an extremely competitive person. At the time I thought the goal was to try and win the class. What happened in this case was, though

unintentional, I expected more of her at the show than I did at home. I had made demands that she wasn't necessarily capable of giving me at the time. I overrode the test and, as a result, Wynnie, in her ever-persevering style, intended to show me exactly what she thought of that.

My lesson learned from that experience was that I needed to evolve as a rider and competitor. In the past, I have competed heavily in team sports—softball and volleyball—where it is encouraged to have that "no holds barred" killer instinct to play hard and push limits all the time. My equine partners, on the other hand, couldn't care less about that. I had become so focused on trying to do well that I was missing out on the joy in riding and forgetting that horses are not "competitive" by nature (for food and herd position, yes; for judges' marks, not so much).

I realize that in day-to-day training, it is important to be focused, goal-oriented and, yes, work hard. The difference for me now is that I keep in mind more on the needs of my horses (mental and physical) and focus less on my goals in the ring. When the horses are fit and happy, the latter seems to take care of itself.

I incorporate cross-training as much as possible. I have a great back field with rolling hills that is great for fitness work. I also use cavaletti and jumping occasionally to keep things interesting. Whatever your training program is, the intensity needs to be consistent whether it is a training day or a competition day. With the added stress of a show, I think often we feel pressure to "turn it on" for the judges and expect more than we should.

Now at shows, I focus more on enjoying the camaraderie with fellow competitors. I keep my expectations at a level my horses are familiar with and they can deliver easily. I also try not to dwell on mistakes or problems that come up in the ring and take away from it what I need to improve...and move on.

My personal philosophy is to remain humble and continue education with perseverance. Show gratitude for blessings in your life and have fun!

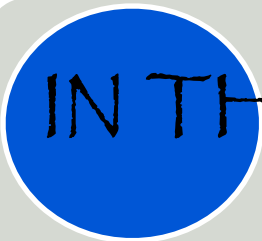

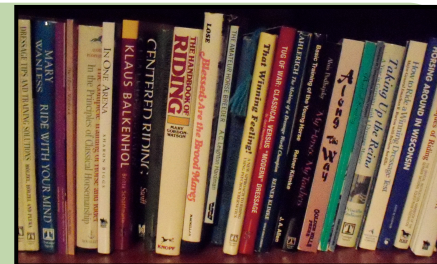
