(Members should all be receiving this publication as a benefit of their WDCTA membership.) Part of the problem is that our calendar always lagged the USDF calendar by one month. Our membership year begins Jan. 1, while

USDF membership year begins Dec. 1. Those renewing in January would miss the January edition, since the USDF roster would typically update by the end of the month – too late for that issue of *Connections*.

By aligning our calendars, we also will be in a better position for success in participating in the USDF “go green” program. By participating, we’ll earn credit toward purchases in the USDF Bookstore, which in turn can be shared with our members.

We’ve also worked hard to modernize and clarify the language in our bylaws. Thank you in advance for taking time to review and comment on the changes we’re proposing.

Also included in this newsletter is part 1 of a report compiled by our bylaws committee reflecting the survey results. I hope you enjoy learning about what other members value in our club. Part 2 will be printed in the December edition of the newsletter. Full results of the survey will be posted on our website at the end of November.

You will need to create a log-in to view them, but you do NOT need to be a current USEF member. There are significant changes to the tests. Take special note on how the collective marks are now organized, which allows the judge to separate a rider's effect of the aids (under submission), harmony with his horse, and the rider's seat and position. This should allow riders to get more detailed feedback on ways they can improve themselves and their technique in the saddle. I appreciate all the thought and work the dressage committee put in to making these improvements, and am excited to perform them in 2011! Just the thought of this makes me think of warm sunny days, shorts and mojitos.

Members, I wish you a wonderful Thanksgiving holiday with family and friends. And if you go out trail riding those last two weeks of November, don't forget your blaze orange and, of course, your helmet.

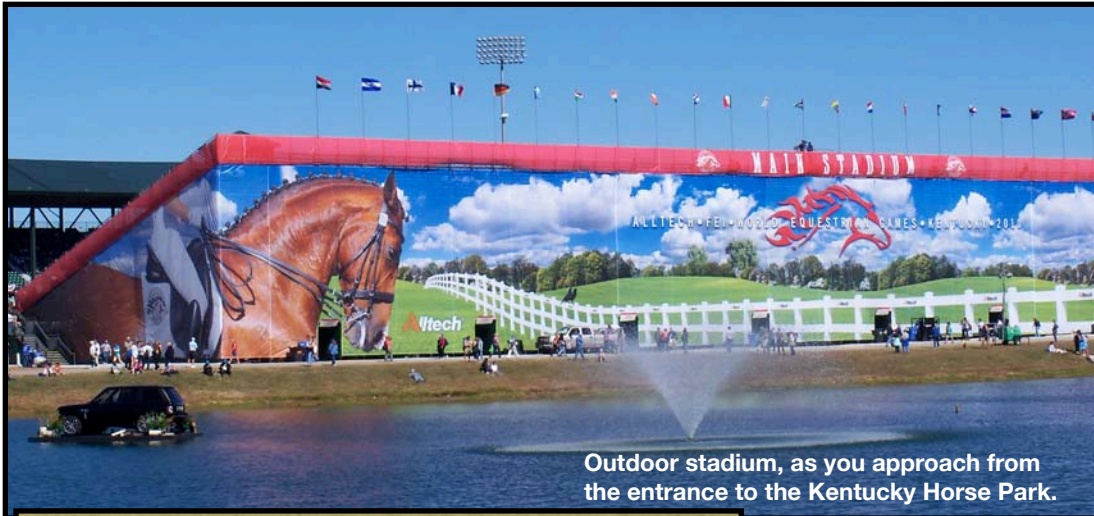

Survey Says.... Value and Satisfaction of Current and Past Members

Coming in December, Survey Part 2: Summary of our Membership Body and Future Initiatives. Full survey results will post to our website in December.

Valued Services

One of the services provided by WDCTA considered a valuable service by the overwhelming majority of the survey respondents is the newsletter. The new newsletter is also very well received, as is the move to the electronic format of the newsletter and the move of minutes from the newsletter to the website.

Other valuable services that are valued by at least 50% of the respondent membership are the website, the USDF group membership, WDCTA-sponsored clinics, chapter meeting programs, WDCTA-sponsored schooling shows and the annual meeting (even though 62% of respondents don't attend), and chapter events other than meetings. The membership supports advertising of non-WDCTA events in the calendar.

Other member services rate...

There is somewhat less value seen in reduced member advertising rates and Facebook group access. The latter may

change over time if Facebook becomes more popular with members. The instructor/breeder/stable listing is also considered somewhat less valuable by most members as are year-end awards in dressage.

Past Members Speak

The data shows a similar trend for past WDCTA members. More than 50% of past WDCTA members expressed satisfaction with their membership and continue to seek information about dressage and club activities by frequenting the website.

Services that do not meet with a lot of support are scholarships, in part perhaps because respondents don't know what is available; awards for eventing, probably because very few respondents are eventers. And not surprisingly, all eventers support eventing awards, state business meetings, and including gaited horse awards (more on the gaited horse awards and other input on future initiatives in next month's issue).

Respondents are split on the value of the Facebook page. This may change as more members use Facebook. Chapter meetings, the DVD/Video library and book library, as well as advertising opportunities are not considered valuable by the majority of respondents.

As to the libraries, perhaps updating the materials would make them more interesting to members or considering an alternative, i.e. electronic format for providing educational materials would be more in step with the technological age we live in.

In Summary...

Members, both present and past, have had a largely positive experience with WDCTA. More than 97% of members surveyed express they will likely renew their memberships for 2011.

Halt at X Gourmet Dressage Cookbook

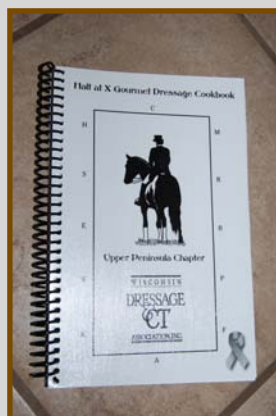

If you take lessons, who do you ride or clinic with?

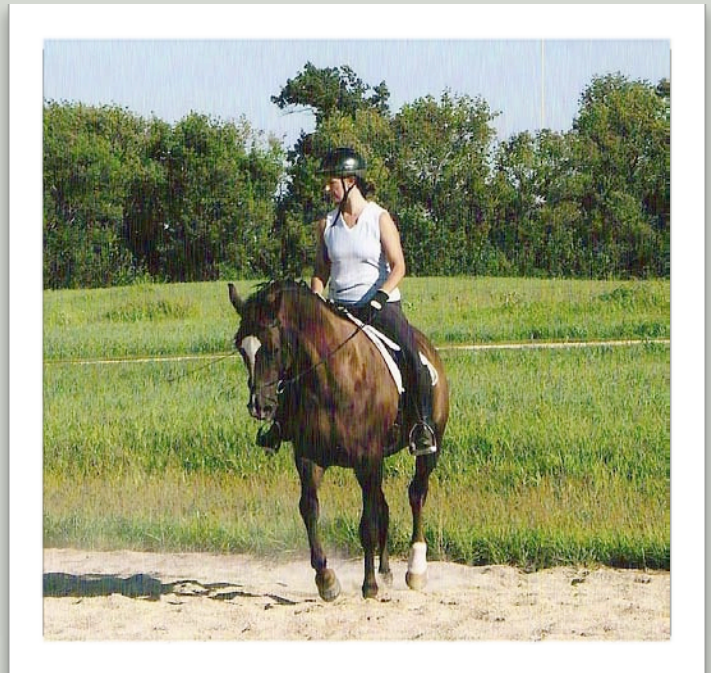

Condolences to Shelly Reichart on the loss of her partner, Skipper, a registered Quarter Horse, standing just over 14 hands, born on February 3, 1977. (Photo at right) Some excerpts from Shelly about Skipper which describes her partnership and probably reflects the sentiments many of us have toward a partnership with a special horse in our lives:

"Over the years, when Skipper and I both brought our A game, we were extremely successful. Highlights include: USDF Regional championship titles (2nd and 3rd levels), USDF All Breeds awards (3rd and 4th levels), USDF Young Rider awards, two-time US Pony Club National Dressage Team and Individual Champion titles, and all the scores needed for my USDF Bronze Medal Rider award, plus some towards my Silver. Together we competed through FEI Prix St. Georges before his well deserved and clearly earned retirement.

"I always have and always will strive to be the type of person Skipper was as a horse...generous and devoted beyond words. Skipper taught me about the value of friendship and respect for another. Never, ever, ever did I take his efforts to compete for granted. He had NO talent for dressage (c'mon, he was a 14 H Quarter Horse!). But, with his huge heart, he showed me that with fair training and genuine respect for the relationship, great things can be accomplished."

Scratches: Frustrating for owners, often painful to our horses

After dealing with the most frustrating case of scratches I have ever encountered, I asked nearly everyone I met what they did to combat scratches. While there are, no doubt, many causes of scratches, the show veterinarian, Dr. Joan McArthur, at the Young and Developing Horse Championships prescribed a remedy that worked great for Rapazzini, clearing up his scratches in two weeks, after I had struggled for four months.

Until this year, I've always had good luck with applying Albydry (used to help clear up cow's mastitis) on the affected areas and then covering with Desitin, but this year, it didn't work. The photo (above right) shows Rapazzini's legs after only a couple of applications of what Dr. McArthur had suggested. Prior to this, you could see no definition in his legs, they were so puffy and weepy.



Following is a compilation of that formula and other suggestions I received:

Dr. McArthur:

Coat the affected legs with Furazone. On Telfa pads, smear Furazone. Then, on the pads, sprinkle crushed SMZ tablets. Apply pads to the raw areas on the leg. (The pads will stick to the legs because of the pre-applied Furazone.) Wrap

with pillow wraps and bandages. Change every one or two days until scratches are gone. No need to pick scabs off.

Belinda Baudin:

If an area is already infected, spray Schreiner's Herbal Solution on affected areas.

Marie Caldwell:

Smear the affected area with Udder Essence Better Balm – but NOT the medicated kind; it has phenol in it and if a horse has an active case of scratches, it would really burn. The labels are both green and look almost exactly the same except the medicated one says "medicated" in blue.

From a couple of Floridians, I heard as a preventative, wash your horse's white legs with the antibacterial hand soap used in your home's soap dispensers.

Forewarned is forearmed! Good luck with scratches "season" next year.
